Labour’s 2024 National Planning Policy Framework introduced big changes, e.g. “grey belt” and the “golden rules”. And the new 2026 NPPF takes those changes further, e.g. the new “presumption” tests, spatial development strategies, national development management policies, and the train station policy. The Government needs those reforms to work – they are used to justify projected GDP increases of several billion pounds. But will they work? Do changes in national policy ever really work? 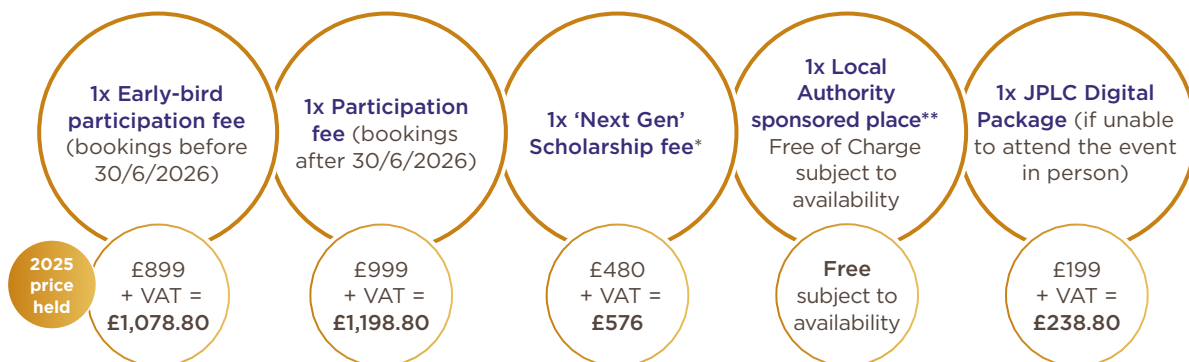

Car Parking
